Of cancers that affect both men and women, colorectal cancer is the 4th leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States and the 4th most commonly diagnosed cancer (2012). Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

of colorectal cancer deaths occur between the ages of 55 and 84 years.





