D YRS celebrated the power of restorative arts in juvenile justice during a mural unveiling at New Beginnings Youth Development Center on January 25. Guests including staff, youth, parents, the US Attorney's Office (partners in the project), as well as representatives from Maya Angelou Academy and the See Forever Foundation viewed "See Your Dream," a project worked on by four DYRS youth under the supervision and direction of Rasheed Cuffee, Maya Angelou Academy, Art Director at the facility's Maya Angelou Academy. US Attorney for the District of Columbia, Mr. Channing D. Phillips, spoke about how powerful such ventures are in that they give youth an avenue to express themselves. Youth D.B. confirmed this with her testimonial, "I kept trying and trying and did something I thought I'd never do - a mural." DYRS Special Assistant to the Director for Restorative Justice, John Ducksworth - who initiated the project - spoke to the history and healing power of art in the restorative justice platform. The mural indeed symbolizes community, love, respect, trust and peace. The agency hopes to continue the project in the community in the near future.
